Honorable Members:

The current SUNY 5-year capital program provides for \$350,000,000 to community colleges to fund a variety of projects. Mohawk Valley's allocation under this plan is \$9.6 million and, as of this date, MVCC has received County and SUNY approval for projects of just over \$1.2 million.

As required with state-funded capital projects, colleges must obtain dollar—for-dollar approval from their sponsors before the State will allocate any funds in support of a project. For matching purposes, the state does allow colleges, with sponsor approval, to count funds obtained from outside sources as the sponsor's match.

In order to respond to SUNY Chancellor's Task Force on campus safety and to plan for security needs of its students, MVCC is respectfully requesting approval from the County to proceed with a security related capital project using \$150,000 in non-County funds as the County's share, which when approved, will generate an additional \$150,000 in state funds. MVCC is also requesting a Campus Master Plan be done which will use \$150,000 in non-County funds from the MVCC Foundation as the County's share, which also when approved will generate an additional \$150,000 in state funding.

In light of the tragedy at Virginia Tech, campus safety has become a very important issue. I therefore request your Board approval for the following:

- a. Establishment of Capital Project H-429 MVCC Security Capital Project, and Capital Project H - 431 - MVCC Master Plan:

Re: Partnership for Youth Grant Award

Attached for your review and approval is a service agreement between the Oneida County Youth Bureau and Oneida County Workforce Development per Board Resolutions and Local Law # 3 of 1991, amending Article VIII, Section 802 of the Administration Code.

This agreement totaling \$154,000.00 provides funding to Oneida County Workforce Development for coordination of youth education and training programs throughout Oneida County. They will be coordinating new mentoring, education and training services through their individual Workforce Development programs and in partnership with MVCC. During the 12 month period of the grants' active period, a total of 40 youth are expected to be provided with the training and skill-building necessary to give them the tools they need to be productive and self-sufficient.

The term of this agreement is December 1, 2007 through November 30, 2008 and the funds are being provided by the NYS Office of Children & Family Services. The delay in forwarding this document for approval was due to a delay at the state level in providing us with the contract documents. There are no county match funds required for the operation of this grant.

I am respectfully requesting your approval of this agreement between the Oneida County Youth Bureau and Oneida County Workforce Development. In addition, because the contract was delayed in arriving from the state, I am respectfully requesting that this be forwarded to the Board of Legislators to be reviewed at their next meeting.

Summary Statements

1) Narrative Description of Proposed Services

The three-phase model described below is the framework for this program:

- Phase I: Work-Based Learning/Basic Educational Training/Life Skills
 A combination of basic skills instruction, pre-employment and life skills training are
 provided. Youth will be exposed to a minimum of 12 hours of conflict resolution and
 diversity training. This training will lay the foundation skills for developing workplace
 skills as well as citizenship skills, and will be ongoing throughout Phases II and III.
- Phase II: Work Subsidy and Basic Educational Skills Training
 The paid work subsidy component is an actual job and will last a minimum of eight weeks. It is designed to expose youth to the actual skills, competencies and requirements necessary for the workplace; to develop work history listing; to enhance the participant's ability to obtain unsubsidized employment as well as to promote the development of job retention skills.
- Phase III: Transition Activities With Continued Support Services
 During Phase III, the participant will successfully transition to independently maintaining
 both the educational and the work subsidy while continuing stable life circumstances.
 Through continued counseling, support and job search activities, and work-related peer
 support groups, participants will be encouraged to do long-term post program planning.
 For participants who have transitioned to educational or training experiences, OCWD
 staff will form linkages with counseling staff at educational institutions and with
 employers to provide transition continuity.
- 2) Program/Service Objectives and Outcomes:
 The following objectives are specific to Oneida County Workforce Development's plan for this grant:
 - 1. Obtain Job Readiness Skills:

- 35 of 40 program participants who are now either unemployed or under employed will participate in a job club or intensive one-on-one job readiness skills training.
- 30 of 35 program participants who now have appropriate job readiness skills will obtain employment or increase earnings.

2. Obtain Employment and/or Increase Employment:

- 30 of 40 program participants who now either unemployed or under employed will obtain employment or improve their current employment.
- Of the 30 program participants who now are employed or making higher wages, 25 participants will retain employment for a minimum of 6 months.

3. Obtain Occupational Skills Training:

- 25 of 40 program participants who now have little to no real occupational skills will attend a training program (i.e. On-the-Job, Classroom, Customized, or Work Experience) in a demand occupation.
- Of the 25 program participants who now have received training in a demand occupation, 20 will obtain employment.

4. Upgrade English Skills:

- 20 of 25 program participants who now do not have sufficient English to find work will increase English skills.
- 20 program participants who now have sufficient English skills will obtain employment.
- 5. Obtain Necessary Wraparound Support Services to Achieve Employment and/or Training Goals:
 - All program participants who now lack needed wraparound support services to be able to successfully completed training or obtain and retain employment will be provided with the needed wraparound support services.

3) Program Design and Staffing

Funding will be used to support a full-time Youth Work Skills Counselor. In addition, additional educational support will come through a contract with Mohawk Valley Community College.

4) Program Reporting Requirements

Monthly Progress Reports are required to be submitted between the 10th and 12th of each month to the Oneida County Youth Bureau using the designated form (OCFS-4873). Progress Reports should contain details and data for the previous month's activities and should carryover the appropriate data from prior reports where appropriate.

5) Fiscal Claims and Reimbursement

All claims for fiscal reimbursement from Oneida County must be submitted on a monthly basis between the 10th and 12th of the following month. Fiscal claims should contain the details and data for the previous month's activities and should carryover the appropriate data from prior claims where appropriate. Claims must be completed using the NYS OCFS APY-WIA "Program Expenditure Summary" and an Oneida County Voucher. One original and two copies are required.

Dear County Executive Picente:

A review of Department expenditures has indicated the need for fund transfers between several Water Quality & Water Pollution Control accounts as detailed below.

A transfer of \$70,000 to G8130.491, Other Materials & Supplies, is being requested. The Department has experienced a higher than usual demand for replacement parts this year. In addition, the price of sodium bisulfite, a chemical used in the disinfection process, has increased significantly and money is needed to cover polymer costs for the remainder of the year.

A transfer of \$50,000 to G8130.493, Equipment Repair & Service Contracts is also being requested. The Department has experienced unanticipated expenditures to clean interceptor sewer lines, had an unanticipated major repair on a blower motor and has to perform unanticipated maintenance on incinerator sludge feed pumps.

No additional appropriations will be necessary to support this request at this time. Sufficient funds are currently available from G8130.495, Other Expenses.

Given the above, I am respectfully requesting the transfers listed below.

The Department of Public Works has secured a grant under New York State's Shared Municipal Services Initiative. The grant application was for \$270,000 of which the County would have had to provide a local share of \$30,000 toward the cost of a rubber-tired telescopic boom excavator (Gradall 4100 Class) with attachments (\$300,000.00). The award we received was \$260,820 (96%) of the original request. The current estimated cost of this specialized piece of equipment is \$310,820.00. We are requesting that the County portion, \$50,000.00, be funded from the 'pay as you go' account.

This department is proud of its efforts to share services and equipment with our towns, cities and villages. This grant will allow us to continue this program and better serve the citizens of Oneida County. Assemblywoman Destito, Senator Valesky and Senator Griffo sent letters of support on our behalf to help secure our chances of being selected. Assemblywoman Destito took extra steps by setting up meetings to better understand exactly what would be looked at in the grant application. Workforce Development Grant Writer Russ Davis spent considerable time working with Deputy Commissioner Dennis S. Davis and Secretary Maureen Kozak on this project and helped us take a proposal that was rejected the prior year and shape it into one that was funded in this current round of State projects.
