

I write to request Oneida County approval for an increase to Capital Project account H500 Academic Building-Alumni College Center Exterior Rehabilitation. This project has previously been increased and unfortunately as we progress with the project we have found there is additional portions of the aluminum window framing and doors that need to be replaced. I am requesting an increase in the Project account of \$26,000 to bring the total budget to \$251,766. The MVCC Foundation will provide the additional 50% local matching amount of \$13,000 with SUNY providing the other 50%. There will be no additional cost to the County. County consideration of this resolution during the September Legislative cycle would be appreciated so we may move forward with doing the project as soon as the semester ends.

I recommend that the Board of Trustees adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the capital construction budget for the AB and ACC Exterior Restorations project be increased by \$26,000, from \$225,766 to \$251,766 and be it further,

RESOLVED that the College's Administration is authorized to secure required sponsor and SUNY approvals.

BACKGROUND

Program regulations (8 NYCCR §603) require SUNY to obtain documents indicating approvals by the college Trustees, sponsor(s) and State University Trustees for any capital project budget.

This project includes removing the brick pavers at the five entryways to the Utica Academic Building and the three entryways to the Alumni College Center, replacing doors at most of those entryways, replacing portions of the aluminum framing of the entryways and replacing the automatic openers on several of the doors.

The Board approved a resolution at the March 9, 2015 meeting increasing this project by \$78,466, from \$147,300 to \$225,766. The County also approved this increase and provided the local share of the increase (\$39,233). This increase was necessary for two reasons: 1) there was additional deterioration of the aluminum framing from the time of the original estimate to the bidding of the project and 2) the bids came in higher than expected.

This increase is necessary because once work began it was discovered the framing and the doors on the Alumni College Center had deteriorated to the point where replacement of the doors was required. The local share of this increase will be provided by the College Foundation (\$13,000) so no additional County funding will be required.

Dear County Executive Picente:

The Sheriff's Office is requesting approval of the attached Agreement with Whitesboro Central School District. This contract will pay for up to (20) Part time Special Patrol Officers to be used to increase law enforcement presence, to decrease the number of incidences at the district and to ensure the buildings' safety and security measures are in place and being followed by students, staff, parents and other visitors at the District's six buildings. The Sheriff's Office will charge the District \$25 per hour per officer to cover the costs of the Special Patrol Officers together with the costs of the uniform and equipment for each officer. Twelve to fifteen officers will work regularly at the district while 5 will be substitutes for any time off taken by the regular officers. The total amount of this Agreement is \$283,700.00.

This Agreement requires Board action at the Board's next meeting. In order to have this Agreement to be in effect at the beginning of the 2015 school year, the attached needs to be approved by the Board of Legislators at their September meeting. The approval of the creation of 20 part time Special Patrol Officer positions will also need to be accomplished at the September meeting.
