Dear County Executive Picente:

Oneida County was awarded \$2 million from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation *Green Innovation Grant Program* (GIGP) to construct the Sauquoit Creek Channel and Floodplain Restoration Project in the Town of Whitestown. The flood mitigation project area stretches along an approximately 1.25-mile corridor of the Sauquoit Creek in the Town of Whitestown on Commercial Drive. Activities to prevent flooding include channel-widening, creation of floodplain benches, areas of bank stabilization and future amenities such as a public access trail.


The Oneida County Board of Legislators Resolution #125, dated June 13, 2018, authorized the County Executive to execute such documents as may be required in order to implement the grant. Project 1 located at Dunham Manor Park in the Town of Whitestown was completed in October 2019 and the balance of the grant funds are to be used on Project 2. Project 2 is located at the CSX tracks in Whitesboro and slated to start in early winter 2020. The complexity of the project required regulatory permits from both State and Federal agencies coupled with the need for multiple landowner easements that has required a longer than anticipated timeframe for construction. The result is the need to extend the term of the agreement with the Town of Whitestown from December 31, 2020 to December 31, 2022.

Therefore, we respectfully request that you submit to the Oneida County Board of Legislators a request to extend the dates of the agreement with the Town of Whitestown from December 31, 2020 to December 31, 2022.



Dear County Executive Picente:

I am enclosing correspondence from Claims Administrator, Gus Boucher, recommending payment of \$6,958.33 to Karen Hilton as the County's portion of a settlement of a property damage claim against the Town of New Hartford and the County of Oneida arising out of a flooding incident which occurred in June 2017.

All parties involved have agreed to settle the matter. The settlement involves a payment to the claimant of \$13,916.66, with each party contributing the sum of \$6,958.33.

Additionally, the County of Oneida will contribute up to \$35,000.00 towards certain work to be performed in and around the creek associated with the flooding incident (the "Creek Project"). The County will have the right to inspect all work prior to remitting payment associated with the Creek Project.

Accordingly, I recommend and request that the Board of Legislators authorize the proposed settlement of this matter as outlined herein.



1). Narrative Description of Proposed Services

This grant will help support the positions of 4 Part-time Law Enforcement Coordinators (LEC) from various police agencies. The LEC are part of the multidisciplinary team (MDT) located at the Oneida County Child Advocacy Center (CAC). The MDT investigates cases of alleged child sexual abuse and severe physical abuse cases. The LEC also act as the liaisons between the CAC, police agencies, the Department of Social Services, and the District Attorney's Office in matters relating to the investigation and prosecution of MDT cases. The LEC participate in case review, assist in increasing community awareness of the CAC and are responsible for inputting data regarding the criminal aspect of MDT cases into the computer program. The grant will also support part of the CAC's Administrator.

The CAC provides on-site law-enforcement, Oneida County DSS Caseworkers, victim advocacy, scheduled medical examinations, counseling, preventive services, child fatality review and a state of the art training facility.


