Dear County Executive Picente,

I am requesting consideration and approval of the attached Master Template to be used for all agreements established between the County and the cities of Rome and Sherrill, and all towns in the County for the control of snow and ice on County roads for the 2021-2022 snow season.

Oneida County is again compelled to ask municipalities to consider a one-year term agreement with a \$6,200.00 per mile rate. This is solely a result of the extreme economic crisis we are all facing because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. While the end of the COVID-19 Pandemic may be in sight, the County continues to experience significant financial losses primarily due to sluggish sales tax revenue. In addition, roll-backs of State funding for State mandated programs are compounding the County's financial challenges. The only exception may be the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Most municipalities will receive a significant financial aid package, however, at this time it does not look like our operating budgets will directly benefit.

The attached spreadsheet details the payment at a center lane per mile rate of \$6,200.00 for the season. The total maximum cost for the 2021-2022 snow removal season is estimated to be \$3,672,694.00. This shared services agreement maximizes efficiency and has been successful in providing an enhanced level of snow and ice control service on County roads.

If you concur with this request, please forward to the Board of Legislators for their consideration and approval.

Honorable Members:

In order to close the County accounting records for 2020, the need for fund transfers appeared in various departmental appropriation accounts throughout the County. These transfers are required primarily due to the need to charge 2020 accounts for actual and anticipated 2020 expenditures occurring in 2020, as required under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).

The transfers are fully covered by surplus funds in the 2020 budgets of other related accounts and will not require the use of funds from the Fund Balance. In most cases, the following transfers are made from unencumbered funds in other appropriation accounts within the respective departments.

Several accounts were known to be running high during 2020, but the exact magnitude of the deficit was not known until GAAP charges were computed in January, February and March 2021. GAAP rules also require us to recognize gross sales tax revenues and record amounts that are shared with the cities and towns in the County.

Therefore, in accordance with Section 610, Oneida County Administrative Code, I hereby request your Board approval for the following 2020 fund transfers. I also request that these closeouts be acted on at the July 13, 2021 meeting.

Dear County Executive Picente:

In a continuing effort to educate and assist individuals in accessing COVID-19 vaccinations throughout Oneida County, we have applied for the Community-Based Workforce for COVID-19 Vaccine Outreach funding through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The advance notice given for the application submittal was very short, and it was necessary to apply without seeking prior Board approval so as not to miss this funding opportunity.

Based on the requirements from the HRSA, Oneida County has applied for an amount not to exceed \$7,840,822 for mobile vaccine education and outreach. The grant funds will fund The Mohawk Valley Mobile Outreach Plan (the "Plan"). The Plan involves education, outreach, and vaccine distribution in low-income communities, Limited English Proficiency (LEP) communities, rural communities, minority populations, and mobility-limited populations. This Plan will be implemented in partnership between the Oneida County and Herkimer County health departments.

Since the HRSA grant does not require a local match, no Oneida County dollars will be expended on these projects.



Dear County Executive Picente:

New York State has announced the availability of grants for local governments to help fund the completion of comprehensive storm water system mapping in the 2021 Consolidated Funding Program (CFA). The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) is requesting proposals with the goal of creating an understanding of drainage conveyances through a comprehensive inventory of Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4). Oneida County is considered a MS4 and participates in the yearly reporting of their efforts to address the management of stormwater discharges in the region.

The Oneida County Departments of Planning and Public Works will work cooperatively to start mapping county stormwater conveyance systems in regulated MS4 communities. The Planning Department through their GIS staff has created protocol that can be used to map the county infrastructure including road drainage systems and outfalls that covey stormwater. The stormwater system mapping protocol was developed for regulated communities within the Herkimer and Oneida Counties region to insure consistency in mapping and data collection efforts across municipal boundaries.

Grants of up to \$75,000 per municipality are available for MS4 mapping. Oneida County will work within two of the larger MS4 communities over the 2 year grant period. If time and funds permit, additional communities will be added. The MS4 grant program requires a local match of 10% that will come from in-kind services. Therefore, we respectfully request that you submit to the Oneida County Board of Legislators a request to authorize you to submit an application to the NYS DEC Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Mapping Grant program for an amount not to exceed \$75,000.

Since the deadline for applications in the CFA is July 30, 2021, it is essential that the Board of Legislators take action on this matter at their <u>July 14th meeting</u>. Should you have any further questions please contact

Dear County Executive Picente:

On March 10, 2021, the Board of Legislators approved an amendment to the energy performance contract with C&S Operations, Inc. At that time, you and the Board were advised that the amendment to the energy performance contract was the first step in this process, and that a financing agreement would be forthcoming. We have now finalized the financing agreement, and the same is enclosed herewith. The terms are largely the same as the prior Taxable Equipment Lease Purchase Agreement, and includes a refinance of the original agreement with the additional funds needed for the amendment.

The original lease agreement called for annual payments of \$1,407,458.34 through 2034 with a fixed interest rate of 4.14%. The enclosed refinance calls for annual payments of \$1,591,919 through 2039 with a fixed interest rate of 3.25%. There is no impact on the 2021 budget, as this agreement included a buy out of our prior lease and new payments are not due until 2022. Furthermore, the savings that we are already seeing with the work performed under the existing energy performance contract, coupled with the additional savings generated from this work, and the additional revenue these spaces will bring will pay for the modest increases we will incur in this refinancing.

Also enclosed are all other documents necessary to close on the financing package. If the enclosed agreement meets with your approval, please forward the same to the Board of Legislators for consideration at their July meeting, as closing is scheduled for July 30, 2021.
