Stormwater Regulation For Local Review Boards (1.5 hours)

Nearly every project that comes before a board for review has stormwater impacts to consider. This course examines the relationship between different types of development and the potential for environmental damage from increased runoff, on-site best management practices, and the specific role of project review boards to mitigate stormwater impacts from new development with local, state, and federal regulations.

Session 2

Construction Stormwater Project Review For Local Review Boards (1 hour)

PRESENTED BY NYS DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

New York General Municipal Law Part 239 requires that certain types of construction projects be referred to County Planning prior to local action being taken to review a project. Once it has been determined that local action is appropriate, local planning and zoning boards need to have the correct information to deem a project complete. The topics for this presentation are MS4 Program Requirements, SPDES Permit General Construction Activity and Local Flood Plain Management. This presentation will help local review boards create better projects and reduce the risks of flood damage during storm events by knowing the DEC regulations for stormwater construction activity and local flood plain management requirements.
